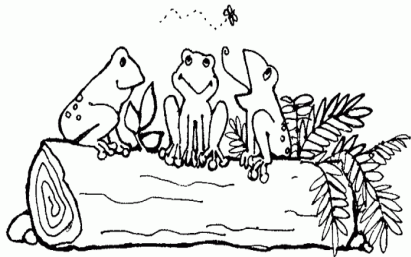

# Become A Junior Naturalist

Welcome to the Benton County Junior Naturalist Program. This is a wonderful opportunity for kids ages 4-18 to experience (and share

with adults) such diverse programs as



environmental education, outdoor recreation, natural resources, conservation, and historical interpretation.

The program encourages kids to work on independent activities and attend programs offered by our Naturalists. This form needs to be finished and turned in within one year of completing your first activity.

When all requirements are completed the participants will receive an official Junior Naturalist patch and certification of achievement.

# Benton County Junior Naturalist Requirements:

## Age:

Our Junior Naturalist Program is open to kids ages 4-18. Participants ages 4-12 will complete Level One and participants ages 13-18 will complete Level Two.

## Public Programs:

Attend three environmental education programs taught by the Benton County Naturalists.

## Independent Activities:

Complete two independent activities such as reading a nature book, fishing, camping, hiking, etc. An adult must sign off on these independent studies.

**Note:** For Level Two (ages 13-18) one of the independent activities must be a one hour (or more) voluntary commitment toward a public conservation program.

## Awards:

Upon completion of the above requirements, participants will receive a certificate of achievement and a colorful Junior Naturalist patch.
